



Profile: Oregon's Occupational Therapist Workforce – 2012

Quick Facts

The number of active licensed occupational therapists (OTs) working in Oregon increased nearly 12% between 2010 and 2012.

OTs identified a practice address in 27 of Oregon's 36 counties.

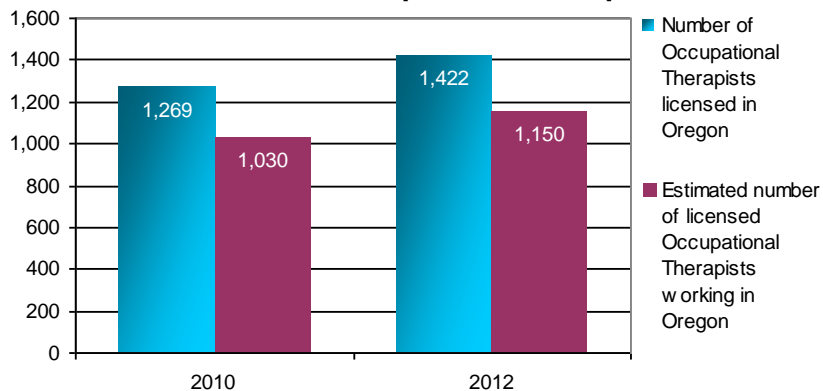
Multnomah County has the largest number of OTs (27%), followed by Washington County (15%) and Clackamas County (9%).

Geriatrics was the most frequently reported practice specialty (512), followed by physical rehabilitation (429).

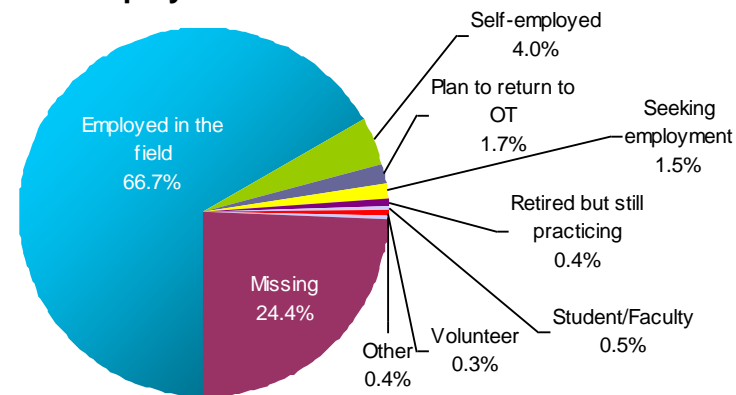
The percentage of OTs 55 years of age and older decreased from 28% in 2010 to 26.7% in 2012.

Among OTs, Spanish was the most frequently reported language spoken (7%) in addition to English. In 2010, 3.4% of Oregon's OTs reported speaking Spanish in addition to English.

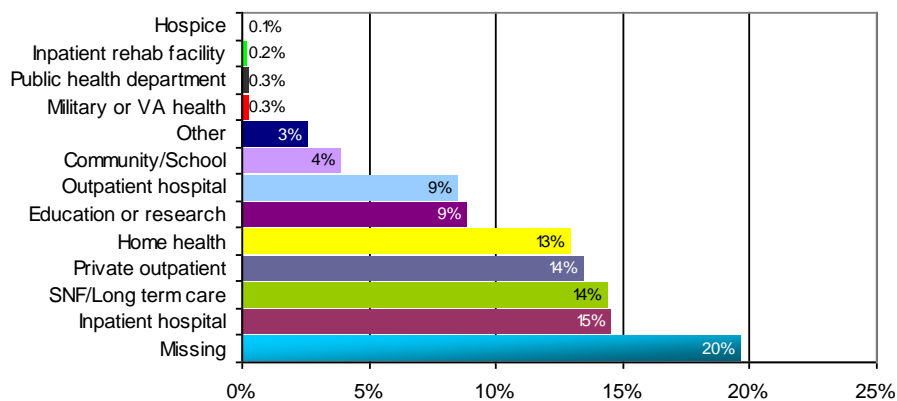
Number of Occupational Therapists



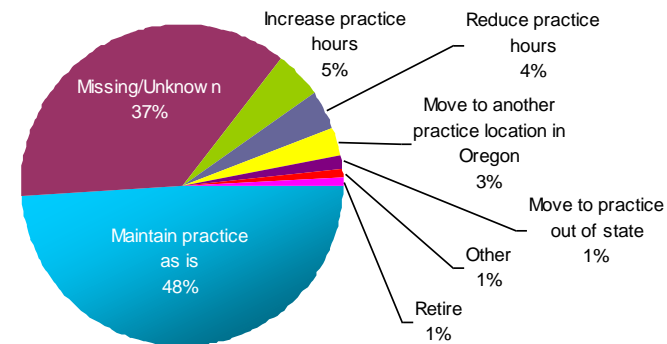
Employment Status



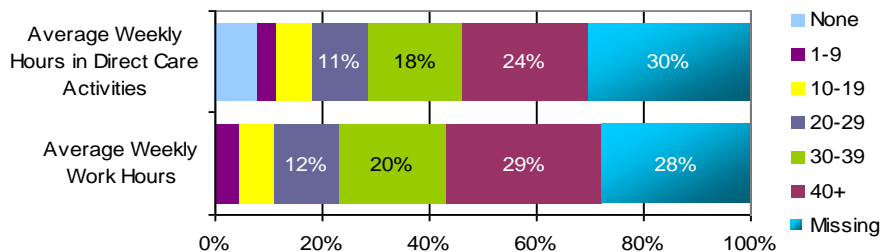
Work Setting



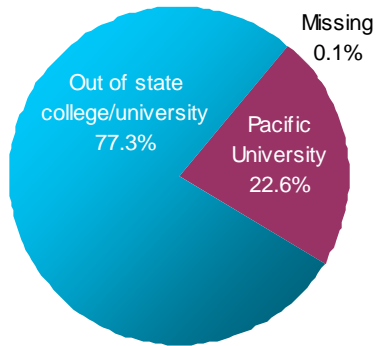
Future Practice Plans in the Next Two Years



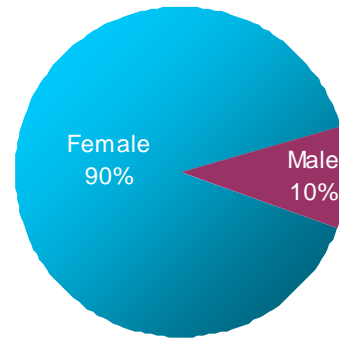
Average Weekly Work Hours Compared to Average Weekly Hours in Direct Patient Care Activities



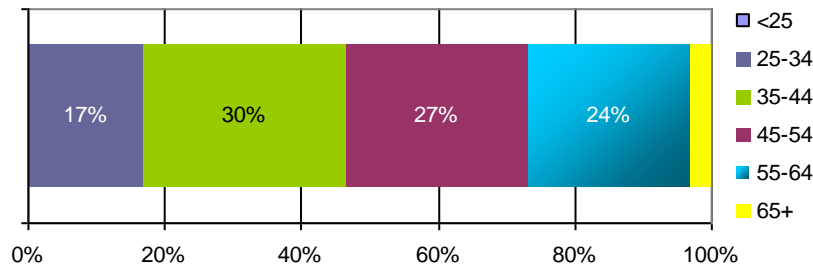
OT School Location



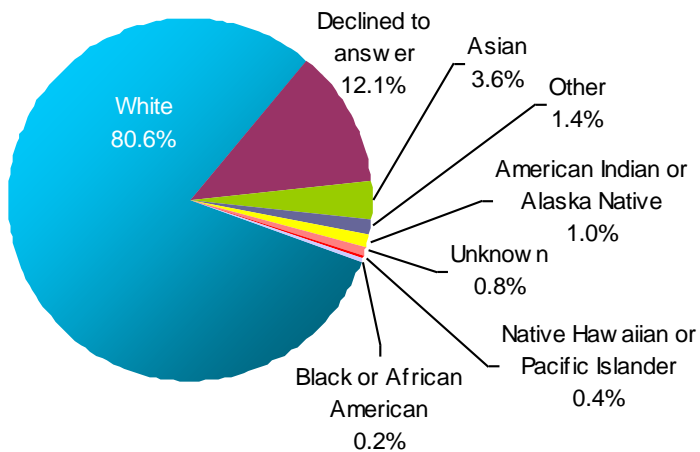

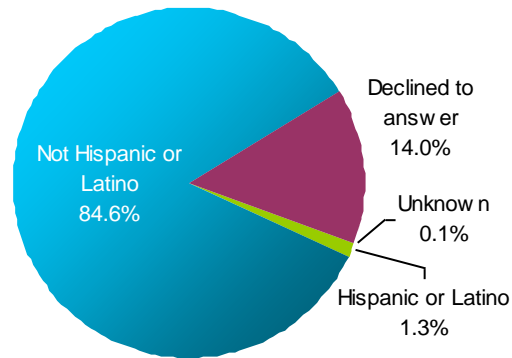
